Maths

- Reception:** The Maths Cup in Reception class is going to Ethan for his fantastic number knowledge. He has a great understanding of numbers and can automatically recall many number facts. He is great at subsidising and recognises numbers within numbers! Ethan is always engaged in our maths lessons and our mastering number sessions and has recently been working on writing number sentences. Well done Ethan!
- Year 1:** Evie received the maths cup because she consistently works hard in all areas of maths, working methodically and carefully with her work. Listening to instruction, practising and using her knowledge in all areas of maths. Especially working hard in her arithmetic test to get 15/15 last half term. Amazing result for a year 1 pupil. Well done Evie you are a star!
- Year 2:** The Year 2 Maths cup went to Darcie. Darcie has made excellent progress in arithmetic. Darcie works really hard and independently in class too. We are thrilled with her work ethic and determination. Well done Darcie!
- Year 3:** The Maths cup in Year 3 went to Josie P. Josie was awarded it for a couple of reasons. Last term, Josie was finding complements to 100 quite tricky. She worked with Mrs Baverstock who showed her some strategies to help her. Josie took these new strategies on board and it really helped her to understand. She then applied this new knowledge to her formal written methods in maths. This then in turn helped Josie with her Arithmetic test and she made the most progress out of both Maths groups in Year 3. Amazing! Josie is a great example of what can be achieved if you are not confident with something, accepting support and persevering will result in progress. This shows good self-regulating learning behaviours. Well done Josie!
- Year 4:** The Year 4 Maths Cup went to Kloe! She has shown a great commitment and positive attitude in her Maths lessons this year. Her confidence has grown too. Her Arithmetic progress has been amazing! In September she scored 22/30 which is a respectable score. However, this half term she scored 29/30! That was the joint top score of the whole class! 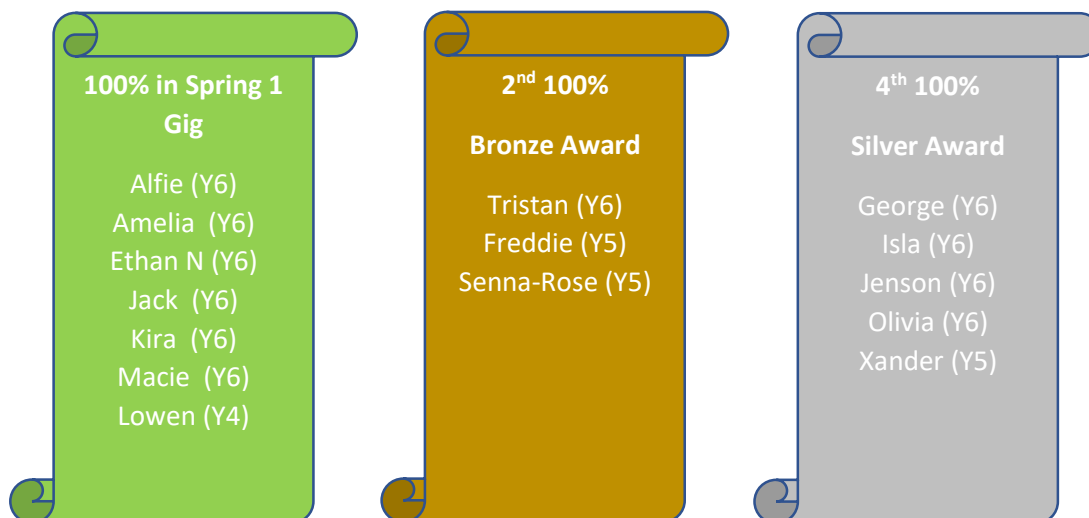
Please return your design no later than 28th February 2023.

We also had **ninety-nine** pupils increase their gig score compared to their December gig:

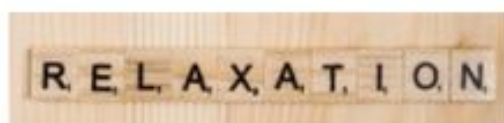
