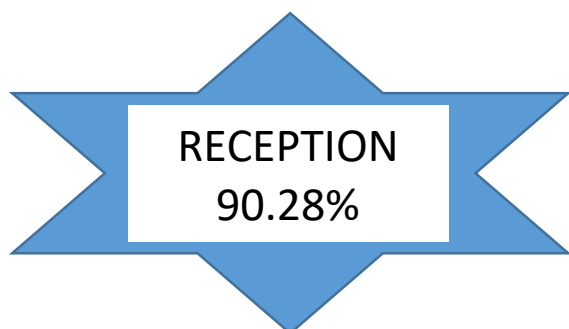
Head Teacher's Awards Awarded 15th December 2023

We are ranked 17th out of 269 for most progress in reading and 13th out of 269 for most progress in maths.

We also made up a second hamper of gifts for the children to have. Miss Tonkin delivered the 2 hampers on Sunday.

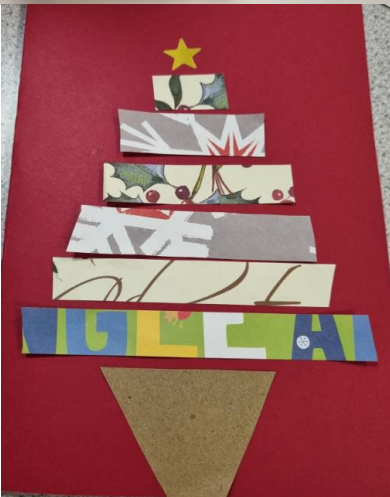
