ANTI-BULLYING WEEK 2022 **'REACH OUT' CALL TO ACTION**

Illness and Medication



A reminder if your child is sick or has diarrhoea, they must be absent from school for 48 hours after their last bout of sickness or upset tummy. For example, if they were last sick on a Tuesday at 3pm, they could come back to school on the Friday.

It is vitally important this is adhered to as sickness and diarrhoea are bugs that spread very quickly between people.

If your child requires medication at school, please make sure it is clearly labelled and handed in through the office. Please do not send medication into school in your child's bag. All medication must be accompanied by a form from the school office.

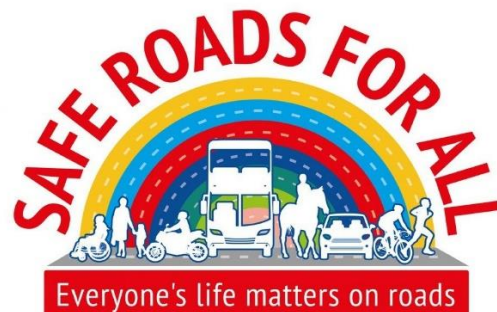
Community Open day
