Headteacher Cup Awards for Writing Awarded 8th April 2022

Reception:

The writing cup in Reception class is going to Summer, the progress she has made this half term is amazing! She forms her letters beautifully and is starting to write sentences with a capital letter and a full stop. She shows great determination and independence when writing and re-reads what she has written to check it makes sense. Well done Summer!

Year 1:

The cup award for writing goes to Poppy. Poppy has become a very enthusiastic writer in Year 1. She uses great language learnt from shared reading and topic work. She is beginning to use Year 1 SPAG rules and her handwriting is improving daily. Poppy also uses her phonics knowledge to accurately spell some common exception words and phonetically spell words correctly. Poppy has worked extremely hard on her writing since September. Well done Poppy!

Year 2:

The writing cup this term went to Beatrice. Bea has worked really hard on her writing this last term. She reads back her work carefully and looks for opportunities to improve or correct her work. She tries really hard to include objectives that we have covered in our lessons and works on this independently. She is working hard on her letter formation and now joins most of her letters. She is beginning to think more about correct spellings and is trying to correct these.

Year 3:

In Year 3, last term's cup for Writing went to Bonnie-May. Bonnie-May has made super progress since January in all aspects of her writing. She has been working hard on her letter formation and handwriting and now has very neat handwriting. She has progressed with her phonics and this is reflected in her writing. She has good ideas when planning her writing and is able to turn these ideas into a good piece of writing. On occasions, she still needs adult support but regularly works independently using her sound mat to help her with unfamiliar words if required. Furthermore, she remains focussed whilst writing, always trying to do her best. She displays fantastic self-regulating behaviours. Well done Bonnie-May! Mrs Campbell and Mrs Mansfield are super proud of you!

Year 4:

Ellie was awarded the Year 4 Cup for Writing last half term. The reason she was chosen was due to her commitment and progress this year. She has worked really hard 1:1 with Mrs Lewis as well as in her Writing lessons. This is proven by Ellie making more than expected progress so far this year. She is taking pride in her English work and is working so hard for a Pen License. She has recently achieved spelling correctly all the Common Exception Words with Mrs Harrison too! We are very proud of Ellie and hope she continues to push herself in the Summer Term. Congratulations!

I know this person would not put English anywhere near the top of their 'favourite lesson' list, making the effort they have put in - and therefore the achievement they have made - doubly admirable.
