





Headteacher's Cup Awards Awarded 16th December 2022 Computing

- **Reception:** The Cup in Reception class this half term is for 'Understanding the World' and is going to Jago! Understanding the World involves guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community. We have explored different environments this half term and visited the Eden Project to allow the children to see, feel and hear the differences between them. Jago immersed himself in this learning and is able to recognise that some environments are different from the one in which he lives. He can use new vocabulary and is able to name different animals that live in the environments. Well done Jago!
- Year 1: The Year 1 winner of the cup was Delilah. During her ICT lessons, she has learnt how to turn the laptop on, log in with the password, open the Paint program and successfully use all the tools in the Paint program to develop her drawing skills on the computer. She worked extremely enthusiastically throughout the lessons over the past term. Well done Delilah.
- Year 2: Ellis loves computers and IT. He was very knowledgeable about how to stay safe online. He could explain what he needed to do if he accessed something that made him feel 'funny in his tummy'. He knew who his trusted adults were. This alongside his enthusiasm for work on the Kindles, his ability to help his peers, all strengthened my knowledge that he was the person to receive the Computing award this term. Well done Ellis.
- Year 3: The cup for Computing in Year 3 went to Chase! During Autumn 1 we looked at Computing systems and networks. Chase was great at identifying the difference between input and output on a digital device. During one of the lessons, the children were tasked with creating a piece of art work on a digital and non-digital device to compare and contrast the two approaches. Chase had amazing keyboard skills when drawing and colouring his picture. He also was very supportive to his peers and helped them. Well done Chase!
- Year 4: Harry D has put in super efforts into our Computing learning so far this year. Mr Moore has been particularly impressed with his knowledge and skills. He was really good at describing the features of a network and the roles of a switch and router. He was confident at directing members of his group to set up a network for the opening task of our Super Learning Day. Additionally, he excelled in the problem solving element of the day which involved finding routes between networks. Well done Harry!
- Year 5: Computing was a challenging cup for Year 5 as a lot of our unit was theory. Therefore, the Year 5 adults came together to consider who has shown computing skills in other areas such as using the Kindles or talking confidently about staying safe online. We are delighted to announce that the Year 5 cup winner is Max A!
- Year 6: The cup for computing this term goes to Alfie. His knowledge of computer systems and networks is impressive and he can explain well how messages are sent across networks. He has also really enjoyed our computing work this half term.



<u>Games</u>

It may well be that for Christmas, you received new games and activities. If your game cupboard is getting a bit full, please consider donating any unwanted items to school. These can then be distributed between class to help children stay entertained during wet breaks. Ideally, quick games such as Uno or Dobble would be best, as opposed to long games like Monopoly. Puzzle books and jigsaws would also be welcome, or quick craft activities like origami.


January Blues
