Please do have a look and make yourself familiar with it. This is the website which will be updated with news and events. The old website will be extinguished so remove it from your favourites and add the new domain please.



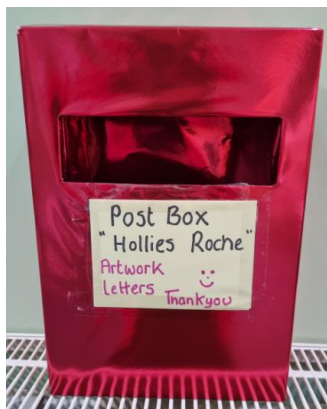
Parent's Evening

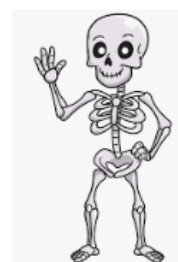


Year 3 – Science Super Learning Day

Mrs Campbell wore the perfect outfit for Science Super Learning day!

In Science we were looking at our skeleton and its 3 main functions: support, protection and movement. We looked at different animal skeletons and identified whether they were a vertebrate or invertebrate (with or without an exoskeleton). We also investigated whether the child with the longest arms would be able to throw a tennis ball the furthest!

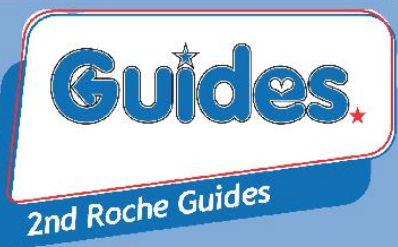
