


Headteacher Awards Awarded 10th May 2024

Wellbeing

At Roche School, all staff are trained in a mental health technique called Emotion Coaching. All staff use this when talking to children, to support their emotional wellbeing and regulation.

It is based on the PACE work of Dr Dan Hughes, and really works!

It can feel a bit "clunky" or unnatural at first, but give it a go and see what results you get.

Curious George

Validate what is happening for the child, for example: "Gosh, this
looks really tough for you right now."
I can see that you are (name a physical response. For example

crying)

I am wondering if you are.... (name an emotion to tame the emotion, never shame it)

How come? (This can be to expand on both positive and negative emotions for example "Wow you tidied your room! How come?")

What/who helped you manage this today? (Focus on coping and managing strategies) Next time what would make this better?
