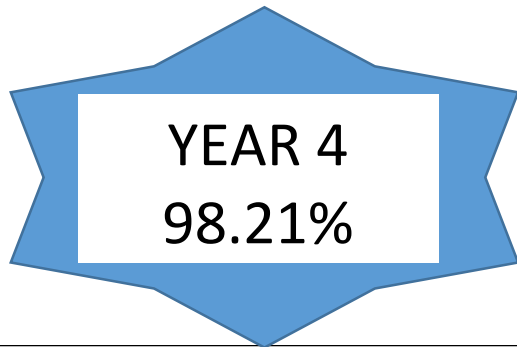

Headteacher's Awards Awarded 13th January 2023

Bradley listened well to the instructions and performed each skill with fluency and control. He was able to demonstrate to the other children how to perform the skills. Well done Bradley, great listening and great behaviour. I am very proud! Keep it up! Jade received her award for great reading. I listened to her read on Monday and then again on Friday and she made good progress. She used all her RWI reading strategies when reading to help her decode unfamiliar words. They drafted, enhanced and edited a narrative called 'The Wishgranter' which is based on a Literacy Shed video. 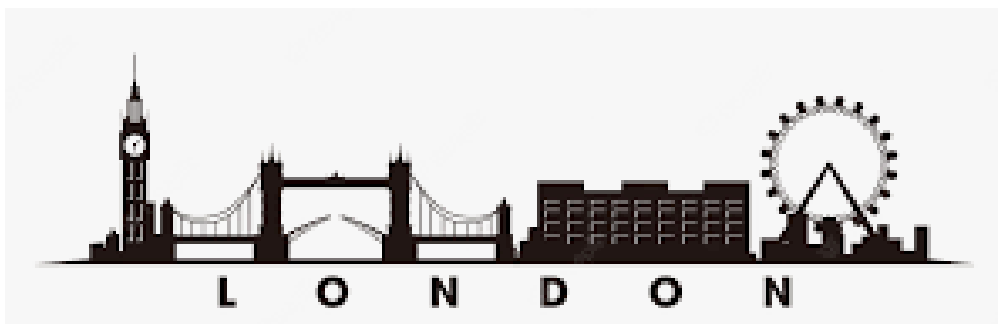
