During the reading of the book:


- · What is happening here?

Questions to ask your child when reading - Early Years

At the end of the book:

- Did you like this book?Why?
- What was your favourite part? Why?
- Which character did you like the best? Why?
- Why did that character do ... (give a situation/ event from the story)?
- What happened in the story?





This week lets go to the Dough Disco!

Make your own playdough if you don't have some already using the simple recipe below. Then, follow the dough disco movements or watch the dough disco videos!



You need:

- 2 cups plain flour (all purpose)
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil (baby oil and coconut oil work too)
- 1/2 cup salt
- 2 tablespoons cream of tartar
- 1 to 1.5 cups boiling water (adding in increments until it feels just right)
- Gel food colouring (optional)

Method:

- Mix the flour, salt, cream of tartar and oil in a large mixing bowl
- Add food colouring TO the boiling water then into the dry ingredients
- Stir continuously until it becomes a sticky, combined dough
- Allow it to cool down then take it out of the bowl and knead it vigorously for a couple of minutes until all of the stickiness has gone.
- If it remains a little sticky, then add a touch more flour until just right



Make a sausage shape by rolling the playdough.

Squash the playdough flat into a pancake shape.



4

Pinch all around the edges using your thumb and fingers.



5

Pass your pancake from hand to hand, left to right then back again.



6

Press each of your fingers, one by one, into the dough.



7

Roll the playdough into a ball in your hands or on a table.









HANDWRITING PHRASES FOR HELPING YOUR CHILD TO FORM LETTERS


This works best if your child practises for a short time every day.

- Show the picture side and air-write as you say the phrase.
- 2. Ask your child to practise in the air with you.
- Using a sharp pencil and sat at a table, encourage your child to have a go.




