



Tec Girls Building and coding a model smart home!

Last week, some of our pupils from Year 5 have built and coded a model smart home, complete with some of the technology you would expect to see in homes right now and some the girls hope will be there in the future!

The girls involved have been taking part in an 8-week afterschool club called TECgirls micro:bit mentors. This year's challenge was to learn about smart home technology, as well as practising their coding, innovation and teamwork skills.

Along with 8 other schools across Cornwall, the girls (and their teachers) joined an online session every Tuesday afternoon led by TECgirls and practised their coding skills on the BBC micro:bit (which is a tiny computer that you can hold in your hand.) By the end of the programme, the girls all programmed a temperature sensor, light-level monitor, air quality monitor and plant moisture sensor to let them know when the plants in the house need watering. They also learned about what engineers, architects and designers do. The club was tied to real world skills and jobs that girls can do in the future in Cornwall. Each school also had an industry mentor and STEM Ambassador who helped them and their teachers on the weekly challenges.

Last Tuesday (2nd July), all the schools came together for an in-person workshop at Mount Pleasant Eco Park. The day started with a talk from Dr Amy Featherstone, Innovation Lead at Kensa Group. Kensa Group employs over 200 people in Cornwall making and installing Heat Pumps. The girls learned all about how heat pumps work and how they can help in the fight against climate change. Dr Featherstone was amazing at showing the girls how exciting a career in engineering and innovation could be.

The girls then all worked in school groups to build their model home using a flat-pack doll's house kit. They are now experts in following instructions from a certain Swedish DIY home store! The girls then attached all the sensors that they had coded during the online part of the programme and then used their creative flair and a lot of recycled materials from the Cornwall Scrapstore to decorate and personalise their smart homes. They also learned about circuits and added LED lights to their homes. Going with the green theme each home was also given its own wind turbine that helped light the bedrooms.

When they weren't busy building houses, they were building solar cars with Jess Burton from Cornwall College Group. The girls learned all about how solar energy works and got to race their cars against each other. The problem solved fixing wheels and even finding the best (sunniest) spots to race their cars. The girls also got a chance to learn all about the exciting green energy future career opportunities in Cornwall.

Congratulations to the following pupils for building their fantastic model smart home and for graduating as 'micro:bit mentors!' **Ruby B, Kezia B, Maisie F, Paige H, Emmie I, Hollie K, Georgia L and Taylor M**. These girls are now confident with their micro:bit coding skills and can support the teachers and their peers with future micro:bit projects. Thanks also to our teaching staff for their support with the after-school club: Mrs Gardner
