Wellbeing Conversation Starters

Talking to your child about how they're feeling can be tough, especially if you're concerned that they're having a hard time. You might not know what to say or feel worried about how your child will react. It doesn't matter what topic the conversation starts with – it's about the opportunity if gives you to talk about feelings and provide comfort.

Whilst the activity is underway, what's the best way to encourage your child to open up? Have a look at some of our conversation starters.

Here are some things you could ask to get the conversation started:

What was the best bit of your day? What did you do today that made you proud? I wonder how you are feeling? What would you like to talk about?

If your child is having a hard time, you can try to find out how they'd like to be supported by asking gentle questions:

I notice you're looking sad/worried etc... do you want to talk about what's going on? I wonder how can I support you through this? What was the biggest problem you had today? What helped? Help me understand... Is there anything you need from me? Space, time to talk, time to do something fun?
