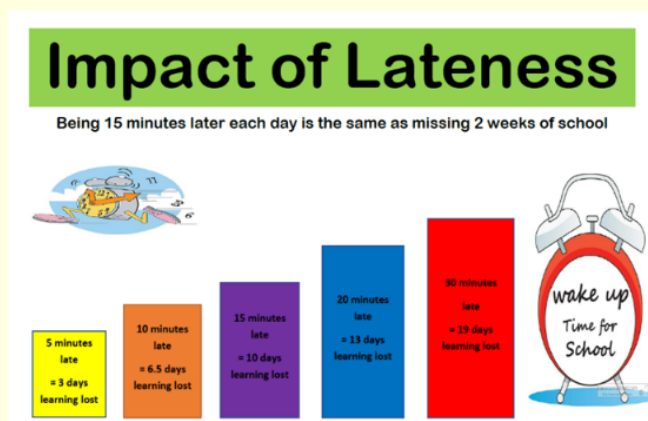

### Weekly Recipe

#### Jam Tarts

##### Ingredients

250g Plain Flour

175g Butter

1 Egg

##### Method

1. Heat oven to 180\*
2. Mix flour and butter until breadcrumb like.
3. Add egg and bring it together to make a dough
4. Roll out the dough and using a cutter make 12 rounds
5. Grease tins and place in the dough
6. Add 1-2tsp of Jam or lemon curd
7. Bake for 20minutes
