Headteacher Cup Awards Awarded 24th May 2024 Awarded for RE

- Reception:** Someone who really came to mind when I thought about our RE lessons was Rosie. During RE, Rosie asks appropriate questions and enjoys learning about different individuals and groups within her own community. She has great cultural awareness and is able to make connections to her own personal experiences. During our last 'Being Special' topic, Rosie was able to share when things have happened in her life that made her feel special such as her birthday and she was able to recall what happens at a traditional Christian baptism. Well done Rosie you have a positive and open minded attitude!
- Year 1:** Lola L is really enthusiastic in her learning. She has loved learning about different aspects of Christianity but has especially liked learning about Judaism including their celebrations. Lola has enjoyed learning about making a Mezuzah which is a special scroll that is in a case on the outside of a Jewish person's house.
- Year 2:** The award for RE goes to Rosie. Rosie could be given an award every day for being enthusiastic and engaged in her learning. Rosie puts lots of effort into her learning into her work but when looking through Rosie's RE work, I noticed that she listens carefully during lessons so that she can complete her tasks effectively. Rosie is a critical thinker and applies her learnt knowledge to new learning. She is able to compare faiths and the different artefacts and symbols from both the Christian faith and the Islamic faith and compare both of their special places to worship. Well done Rosie.
- Year 3:** The celebration cup for RE went to Raeven. Last term we were looking at Hinduism and how Hindus worship. Raeven was focused in all lessons and participated well in class discussions. The work she produced was presented beautifully. Well done Raeven!
- Year 4:** Year 4 really enjoy our RE lessons and their respect is fantastic! However, the Year 4 Cup was awarded to Bea for her amazing contributions and her positive attitude to all our RE lessons. Her questions are fantastic as well as her empathy, understanding and growing knowledge. Bea was also nominated by several of her peers in class for her great efforts in RE lessons. How super that they noticed too! Well done Bea.
- Year 5:** I have been SUPER impressed with RE from everyone this year! We did some revisiting the other week and I was astounded by the amount that you could remember! However, there can only be one winner - Ruby! Looking back at knowledge organisers, Ruby has reflected on what has been taught, and often thoughtfully considered how it may impact everyday life and behaviours, asked thoughtful questions, and also added additional facts – not just stuck with the key objective. Well done!
- Year 6:** The RE cup is being awarded to Charlotte, as she always listens and contributes well during RE lessons. She demonstrates empathy and maturity when considering different religions and displays an understanding that the way people from other religions live their lives may be different to her own. Charlotte always asks lots of questions and is keen to learn more about the different religions and is able to discuss these in an unbiased manner. When learning about Science Vs religion she was also able to consider both viewpoints fairly. Well done Charlotte.

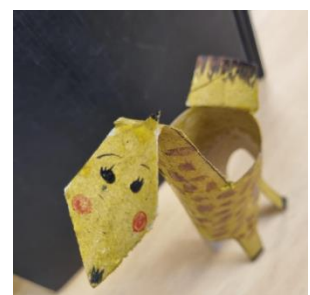
