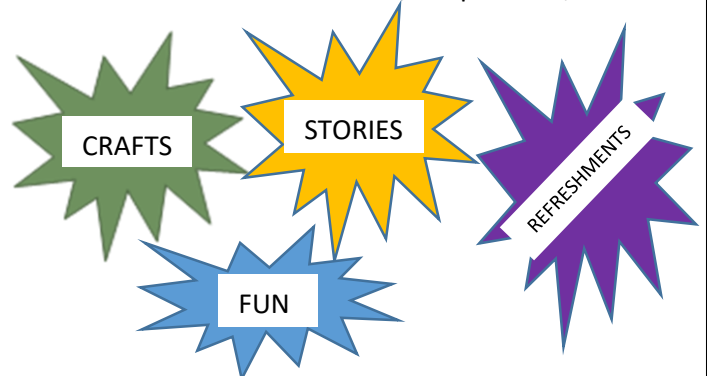


Messy Church

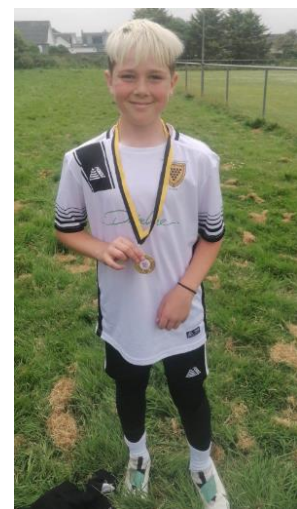

- The pleasure of helping students reach their potential

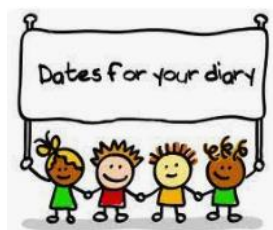
What is the Governing Body's Role?
