



Pupils will have their targets by the end of this week, let's see if we can get over 100 pupils increasing their gig score in Summer 1!


Wellbeing Coping Kit

Even doing just one positive thing every day can help your mood. Not sure what you want to do today? Use our tool to help.



We have the band playing music, bouncy castle, food stalls, skatepark activities, games, stalls & more to follow.


If you are interested in joining the March up through the village, we will be leaving the victory hall at 11am.

If you are unable to make the Scarecrow(s) after Registration or it is damaged, removed or stolen during the Competition, please continue to display your Registered Number together with a sign saying "Withdrawn".

 Your Scarecrow will be photographed during the week and the photograph displayed In the old shop window on Chapel Road.

5. The competition will be judged by the people of Roche. Voting slips will be available from Saturday 22nd July and will contain the location of all Registered Scarecrows and will be available from Roche School Roche Football Club and Victory Hall Social Club or by Email rocheyfc@gmail.com or rochecarnval@outlook.com
